

Unitarian Hurricane Reconstruction Activities on the Gulf Coast.

Sunday August 19, 2007 at 9:00 AM the meeting at the Fellowship will discuss ongoing Gulf Coast reconstruction activities. Hurricane Katrina struck in late August 2005 affecting an area as large as England. The affected area is still a mess.

Unitarian-Universalists are part of a largely faith-based reconstruction effort along the Gulf Coast assisting in the aftermath of one of the most damaging hurricanes on record.

What are UU's doing to assist in the reconstruction? Our UU representative and coordinator Jennie Trabulsi has left the area.
